

An unusual George III Butter Spade/Canape Server made in London
in 1817 by Roger Peppin.

Description

The Serving Spade has a triangular shaped blade unusually pierced with square motifs. The plain silver section of the handle is engraved with a reeded band and is attached to a turned fruitwood section, at the end of the handle. This example is in excellent condition and is well marked on the reverse of the blade.

Roger Peppin was a fine maker of flatware and serving pieces during this period from workshops at 27, Greville Street, Hatton Garden. Length: 7.25 inches, 18.13 cm. Width of the blade, at the widest point: 1.5 inches, 3.75 cm.
